



Carlos Rene Buenteo

August 3, 1949 - September 19, 2019

Carlos Rene Buenteo was called to Heaven on Thursday, September 19, 2019 at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston after courageously battling acute myeloid leukemia at 70 years of age.

He was born August 3, 1949 in Yoakum, Texas, the youngest of three sons to Evaristo and Josefa (Canales) Buenteo. Carlos Rene was a 1968 graduate of Yoakum High School. He received his Bachelor and Master degrees in Criminal Justice from Sam Houston State University in Huntsville, Texas.

He spent 32 years in public service as an Adult Community Supervision and Corrections Unit Supervisor for Bee, Live Oak, and McMullen Counties. Carlos Rene also proudly served his country for 25 years and retired as First Sergeant in the United States Army Reserve – 352nd Engineering Company.

Carlos Rene met the love of his life, his “rock”, Elda Trejo Buenteo in Alice, Texas in 1970. They were married at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Alice, Texas on August 19, 1972 and were blessed with 47 glorious years together.

He was a devoted parishioner of St. George Catholic Church in George West since 1975. Carlos Rene spent much of his time helping with the food pantry where he took great pride in helping others. He was also a member of the George West Kiwanis Club.

A man of many passions – he loved working in his yard, traveling, grilling, gambling, listening to Czech Polka music, and golf. He was an avid sports enthusiast and enjoyed cheering on the Houston Astros, Dallas Cowboys, and Texas Longhorns.

Carlos Rene was a humble, kind, and generous man. He was a loving and devoted husband and a caring, selfless father who showered his daughters with lots of love and affection. He loved life and had an infectious smile and laugh. His greatest joy was his family and friends.

Loved ones that cleared the path to Heaven for Carlos Rene were his parents, Evaristo and Josefa (Canales) Buenteo; his grandparents, Blas and Victoria Buenteo and Zenon and Catalina Canales; his father-in-law, Cecilio Trejo, Jr.; his sisters-in-law, Maria Zelma "Lita" Buenteo and Lydia Buenteo; and nephew, Roland Buenteo.

“ I first met Carlos Buenteo when he interviewed for the position of Adult Probation Officer with the San Patricio County Adult Probation Office in 1975. The Governor's Criminal Justice Division had just funded a grant to expand the Probation Department to provide Adult Probation Services to Aransas, Live Oak and McMullen Counties. Carlos was an easy choice and joined the Department as the first professional probation officer for Live Oak and McMullen Counties. Carlos would serve the District and County Courts with distinction for 32 years and was relied upon as a contractor by two succeeding Community Supervision and Correction Department administrations after my retirement in 2008. Carlos was the first person I knew that could drink Shiner Beer, which in 70's was saying something, as Shiner was not the great beer we now can purchase. I only received one complaint on Carlos in those years we worked together. It seems the County Auditor in Live Oak County objected to Carlos working in the evenings. As it were Carlos would take reports from working probationers in the evening so they would not miss work reporting during the day. The Auditor also liked to work in the evenings when her husband was hunting raccoons at night and she was surprised to find our clients in the courthouse at night. We weathered that complaint together and Carlos, ever the diplomat, was able to reassure the Auditor that she would be safe. Carlos was a decent, honest man without fault. He made my job easier and we eventually took the Department from a staff of 7 and four counties to a Community Supervision and Corrections Department serving 5 counties with 67 employees. Carlos was a big part of that process and could not have happened without his counsel and support. I was blessed to have worked with Carlos Buenteo for 32 years. His passing is a loss to us all.
