



Carmelina de la Maza

September 6, 1925 - November 15, 2021

Carmelina was born in Santiago de Cuba, Cuba on September 6, 1925 and joined her savior on November 15, 2021. She was a faithful and dedicated wife to her husband of 30 years, Rene de la Maza, who died in 1979 at the age of 59 leaving her widowed at a young age. She had unconditional love for her family as a mother, grandmother, great grandmother, and sister.

In 1962, the de la Maza family, Carmelina, Rene, and daughters Miriam and Margarita, immigrated to the United States from Cuba escaping communism. They had a brief stay in Miami, lived in Fort Worth for 2 years, then settled in San Antonio in 1964. Carmelina and Rene, who was a language professor at St. Mary's University, were socially active in the Cuban community and other social clubs. Carmelina and Rene both played the piano and sometimes would entertain Piano 4 hands duet at events. Carmelina was a Seamstress of the Court of the Order of the Alamo and made over 60 Coronation Fiesta gowns in the span of about 30 years. She took the utmost pride and care in making each gown which represents a work of art.

In 1992, she lost her daughter Margarita de la Maza. She is survived by her daughter, Miriam de la Maza, granddaughter, Amanda Lea Gonzales Esquivel, great granddaughter, Skyler Esquivel, and sisters Bertha Gardner and Dulce Lorenzo.

She was a strong, talented, and amazing woman with a sense of humor and a contagious laugh. Her legacy will live on through all who knew and loved her.

“ It is with sadness that I received the news of Carmelina’s passing. With her goes that generation to which she belonged. That generation that taught us real values and gave us the example of their dedication and hard work, that would give their children the opportunity of a future better than the one they would have had if their parents had never been willing to leave everything behind.

Carmelina had a special place in my heart, being part of some of the sweetest memories of my childhood.

My parents and older siblings, as well as us kids (Lisette, Jose Ángel, and myself) looked forward to those Sundays in which my brother Rene, Carmelina and their two little girls would come to spend the day with us. For the kids that meant a day of fun in which we would have the opportunity to play “a las casitas” in the big double door of my parents living room, and many more games, mostly with my niece and “amigueta” Miriam, who was only two years younger than me. Lisette and Jose were my sister’s kids. Margarita was very little and did not enjoy playing with the older kids.

But this is about Carmelina, not us.

René and Carmelina would delight us playing sitting at the piano and playing songs that the adults requested. Rene would be telling funny stories that made the adults laugh, to which Carmelina contributed with her interventions in the conversation, in her unique ways, filling the air with laughter and our hearts with joy.

Many are the memories that come to my mind, but Another one that I will never forget occurred a few days before the Bay of Pigs.

We lived in the outskirts of Havana, not far from the Havana International Airport, and it was normal to hear the planes flying above. That afternoon, suddenly a different sound was heard, the sound was not of a comercial aircraft. It sounded more like a light plane, and in fact that is what it was. From that plane flyers were being sent down which contained statements against Fidel and his government. The adults got very concerned and Carmelina, worried about what could happen as a result of that, immediately got all the kids under the beds, as a precaution, thinking of the possibility of the government sending a military aircraft to bring that other one down. Fortunately that did not happen. We wanted to think that the “avioneta” had made it back safely after accomplishing its mission, but the impression of that day is still vivid in my mind.

It was that attitude of love and seeking protection for her family what drove her actions and decisions in life. An example worth of recognition and imitation.

Good bye my dear Carmelina. You will always have a place in my heart. Love you.
