She truly believed that God was molding her heart, sometimes using unpleasant

circumstances, so she would be more like Jesus in her heart.

- her faithfulness in Bible study. She had a zeal, curiosity, diligence in pouring over scripture, and an eagerness to learn all she could. Her voracious appetite was wonderful.

- She shared her research with others. She sent us her Excel spreadsheet of the Kings of Israel and Judah (SO MANY similar names in both kingdoms). After getting permission from her, I passed it along to my pastor, who was quite impressed with her research and accuracy.

- her humility and teachability. When God showed her some new insight into what He wanted to change in her she did not fight it. She was comfortable being shepherded and submitting to HIS work. We used to read a chapter and discuss it. She would say things like, "I used to have an attitude about that person but God showed me that wasn't right. He changed my heart about that". God really was her shepherd. Ps 23

He restores my soul;

He guides me in the paths of righteousness for the sake of His name.
