



## Ethel Jeanne Weisbaker

July 8, 1924 - September 29, 2020

Ethel Jeanne Weisbaker, born in New Castle, Pennsylvania, on July 8, 1924, to Alice May (Currie) and Gurth W. Rapson, she was named Ethel for her mother's close friend, but called Jeanne throughout her life. She was baptized at Third United Presbyterian Church. She graduated from New Castle High in 1942, and married Dale F J Weisbaker on April 10, 1944. They had two children: Linda Jeanne, and Jeffrey Dale.

Following Dale's jobs, they moved to Clarksburg, West Virginia, then to Cleveland, Ohio, and, eventually to Texas. Although she became accustomed to Texas, she always missed the changing seasons typical of "home" in Pennsylvania. They joined Shepherd King Lutheran Church in 1962 when they moved to San Antonio. She remained an active member, especially involved in making quilt tops and school kits for Lutheran World Relief. In the early 70s she began volunteering at Lutheran General Hospital, transferring to St. Luke's Lutheran Hospital when it opened. She continued her volunteer commitment for many years, accumulating many more hours than any other volunteer, and received a Presidential Citation for that dedication. Jeanne was also active in Daughters of the Nile and a member of Eastern Star.

Jeanne passed peacefully into the Church Triumphant on Tuesday, September 29, 2020. She is survived by her daughter Reverend Linda and husband Reverend Bill Mosley, son Jeff, granddaughters Julie Jeanne and Renee Charlette, two great-grandsons, five great-granddaughters, two great-great-granddaughters; and sisters Joanne, Judy, and Karen, and brother Donald.

She was preceded in death by her husband Dale, her parents, sister Marjorie, and brother Richard.

Rest eternal grant her, O Lord; and let light perpetual shine upon her.
