Gloria was epic in her style and taste developed by years of work at Marshall Fields. She also served and retired from serving as a teacher's aide from the Little Flower Catholic School and SAISD. Her most important job was grandmother to Nathan. She got to help as "Memo" Day Care when she retired, and Nathan was born. She was so proud of his tremendous accomplishments in the academic classroom and never missed any of his school plays, ceremonies, football game performances as a member of the Antonian HS Band and his years as a drum major. She also watched the Texas Tech games on TV hoping to get a glance of the Goin' Band from Raiderland as Nathan's number one fan. By the time he got to Tech she could not travel but always followed every step on his next journey.

We will miss her passion for Christmas decorations, her backseat driving, her homemade meals dropped off after long school days, her style and fashion sense, her joy for good caldo, her favorite margaritas and trips to her favorite Mexican restaurants, her calling about shark attacks before a beach trip, her pride for our family, her beautiful smile and heart. She lived a wonderful 82 years and was so strong at the end for all of us and guided us so we could find peace.
