

Gordon Eugene Mahan Jr.

April 10, 1959 - July 13, 2021

Gordon E. Mahan, Jr., 62, of Floresville, left our world on July 13, 2021, after a private but intense, 18-month battle with cancer. Better known to many as "Donny", he was the alpha of his dog pack, working hard until the day his health forced him to retire earlier this month. He was a proud father, loving son, devoted husband, compassionate Papa, loyal uncle, diligent boss, the best bubby, and a steadfast friend. A tireless fighter, Gordon maintained his positive attitude until the moment he passed in the comfort of his own home, surrounded by his wife, children, grandkids, and his faithful pets.

Born in Germany as an Airforce "military brat", Gordon and his family lived in many places before eventually establishing roots in San Antonio. There he graduated from the South San West Campus and soon encountered the person who would become his best friend and companion for life, Stephanie. Together, the loving couple raised four wonderful children who blessed them with four equally amazing grandchildren.

Family was everything to Mr. Mahan. As the thoughtful son that he was, he made it a tradition to take his mother to breakfast every single Sunday. Following the tragic and unexpected death of his baby sister in 1993, he took in his niece and nephew, Scotty and Brandi, and cared for them as if they were his own children. Cherished by his kids, he was there for them every day and taught them all the valuable life lessons about work, marriage, parenting, and life. There was nothing this remarkable character wouldn't have done for those he loved.

Gordon was a loyal San Antonio Water System (SAWS) employee and proudly dedicated 38 ½ years of his life to serving the company and the community. Although originally fulfilling an entry-level job as a high school graduate, he ultimately rose to become the Senior Director of Distribution and Collection Operations. He was known to encourage anyone he worked with to pursue opportunities to move up in the organization, just as he did. His career saw him form and manage the tapping crew that set a world record in the 1994 main tapping contest hosted by the American Water Works Association (AWWA). Additionally, he was influential in establishing in-house construction efforts designed to

modernize aging water and wastewater infrastructure. Mahan also played an integral part in updating infrastructure with high-density polyethylene pipe and facilitated SAWS' restoration work through the development of a quick-setting flowable fill. The innovative leader was passionate about training and safety, always keeping his teammates' well-being at the forefront of his mind.

Like a true Texan, Gordon was a solid barbeque enthusiast. He had a knack for smoking briskets and turkeys and thoroughly enjoyed holiday dinners both at home and with his SAWS family. Everyone will remember how much he loved to judge and compete in family and company cooking competitions, and no one will forget his refusal to concede to other victors.

Mr. Mahan was an expert craftsman who could build or repair just about anything, including houses, cars, and sewer systems. The film buff was a big fan of classic rock, bowling, Ford trucks, barbacoa tacos, TikTok, peanut M&Ms, rocky road ice cream, his dogs and even his chickens, and of course, his beloved Spurs and the Cowboys. Much like his passion for golf, he also had an obsession with fishing. He organized, hosted, and directed countless coastal fishing tournaments that united the SAWS family that included current and retired employees. As a modern-day hero, Gordon's legacy will live on in the hearts and minds of all who knew him, and his presence will forever be missed — especially by his loyal canine companion, Panda, who remained by his side until the very end.

This extraordinary man was preceded in death by his father, Gordon, Sr.; sister, Holly; and father-in-law, Edward E. Zimmerman. Gordon is survived by his loving wife of over 37 years, Stephanie; his mother, Dolores; mother-in-law, Sally; his children, Krissy, Justin, Trey, and Samantha; daughter-in-law, Shannon; grandchildren, Jaylan, Aidan, Asher, and Emily; sister, Mary; brother-in-law, Roger; nieces and nephews, Scotty, Brandi, Laura, Nikki, Che, Tricia, Jimmy, and Zach; and many extended family members, in-laws, friends, and colleagues.

Upon his request, Mr. Mahan will be cremated, and his ashes will be placed under the oak tree at his home in Floresville, where he loved to enjoy his life. Visitation will be July 23rd, from 5 - 8 p.m. at Mission Park Funeral Chapels South. A funeral service will be Saturday, July 24, 2021, at 2 p.m. at this location.
