On Wednesday, 27 January 2021, Johnny Lopez, loving husband and father of two children, passed away at the age of 88. Johnny was born in San Antonio, Texas to Janie Benavides. He was part of the ROTC program while attending Lanier High School. He would later join the ranks of the 1st Marine Division, 7th Marines in the United States Marine Corps in 1950. In November and December of 1950, he would participate in the Korean War conflict known as the Chosin Reservoir. After being honorably discharged in 1952, he would work as an electrician at Kelly AFB till 1974. In 1959, Johnny would marry, Mary Moreno. They would raise one son, Johnny (John) Lopez, Jr. and one daughter, Linda Laura Lopez Schmidt. In 1975, he would move his family to Sacramento, California and work as an electrician at McClellan AFB till 1995. While employed at McClellan AFB, he was a senior union steward for A.F.G.E. After retiring in 1995, he would enjoy working on the yard, watching football as a Cowboys fan and going to Las Vegas, Reno and Lake Tahoe. Johnny is predeceased by his grandparents, Ben and Mary Lopez; his mother, Janie Benavides; three aunts, Lucille, Julia and Lily and one uncle, Willie. He is also predeceased by his wife, Mary (Moreno) Lopez. Jonny is survived by his two children, Johnny Jr., Linda; grandson, Alan John (AJ) Schmidt and numerous other loving family members and friends. Visitation will be held on Sunday, February 21, 2021 from 6:00 - 9:00 PM at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North. Graveside services will be held at 10:45 AM on Monday, February 22, 2021 at Ft.
