



Mary Ardis "Smittie" Rucas

July 16, 1934 - September 11, 2020

Mary Ardis "Smittie" Rucas, of San Antonio, passed away on September 11, 2020 at the age of 86. She was born July 16, 1934 in Wichita, Kansas to S. Lewis and Ardis W. Smith. She graduated from Kansas State University in 1956 with a Bachelor of Arts in English; that same year she married Maurice D. "Mark" Rucas. They raised three children; Scott, Stan and Amy Raff. During which time they moved to Santa Fe, NM, Orange, TX., Waco, Corpus Christi, and finally settling in San Antonio in 1971; where she received master's degrees in education from Trinity University, St. Mary's and Incarnate Word.

She worked in education for many years as a teacher, counselor, and testing diagnostician. In her late 40's, she changed careers to accounting, attending UTSA, became a CPA and worked for Valero until retirement.

She was an active member of the First Presbyterian church in San Antonio for over 40 years; acting as a Deacon, attending Bible study classes, and operating the library. She volunteered for Loaves and Fishes and The Christian Dental Clinic.

Her retirement years were spent snow skiing in Colorado, traveling to Europe where she would spend several months each year in France. She especially loved Paris, visiting museums and cultural sites, meeting people in café's, and perfecting her French.

Mary was preceded in death by her husband, Maurice D. "Mark" Rucas. She is survived by her brother Frederick Smith of Wichita, KS, her three children Scott, Stan, and Amy, and her six grand children Hailey, Zachary, Mark, Catherine, Justin and Megan. Visitation will be from 3:00 P.M. to 5:00 P.M. on Sunday, September 20, 2020 at Mission Park Funeral Chapels North, 3401 Cherry Ridge Drive. The Service will begin at 1:30 P.M. on Monday, September 21, 2020 at First Presbyterian Church. A Private Interment for family will follow at Mission Burial Park North.


