Maysel Kirch Northrup joined her Lord on December 3, 2020 in San Antonio, Texas at age 94. She was a mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, but greatest of all, she was a devout follower of Christ. The seeds of faith she planted in the lives she reached as a missionary continue to bloom today in various corners of the world. Maysel leaves behind a beautiful legacy of faith, generosity and service.

Mrs. Northrup was born on November 18, 1926 in Absarokee, Montana to J.F. Kirch and Alice Schwenneker. She grew up on a ranch surrounded by majestic snow capped mountains, big blue skies and open pasture. After marrying her husband Rodney Glenn Northrup on June 22, 1947, the couple moved to Mexico in 1950 to serve as missionaries.

The city of Saltillo was their mission field, and their home base of Rancho Altamira served as the beating heart of their mission - a place where thousands would come to know Christ. As the Northrup's learned Spanish and preached the Gospel in the city and surrounding rural areas, Maysel played the piano to accompany church singing, and used the more portable accordion to play in remote Mexican villages.

The couple had three children that they raised on the ranch: Mark, Anita and Destiny. Rodney, with Maysel by his side, helped plant multiple churches, hosted Christian conventions, welcomed mission trips and organized summer Bible school. The Northrup's served in Mexico for more than 50 years, and their family multiplied to become a Christ-loving bilingual and multicultural bunch spread out across the continent.

Maysel was known to be a prayer warrior for her family. She actively taught her children and grandchildren to always put their trust in the Most High. She lived courageously, and did not allow ailments in her body to keep her from nourishing her spirit by worshiping God and reading His word. Maysel was also a big believer in higher education, and actively

supported the college education of all of her grandchildren. She hung their diplomas proudly on her bedroom wall. Maysel even went on to earn a BA degree, graduating on stage alongside her daughter Anita. Years later, Maysel and Rodney both received Honorary Doctorate Degrees from their Alma Mater, Northwest Christian University in Eugene, Oregon.

Mrs. Northrup is preceded in death by her husband Rodney and daughter Sylvia Destiny Lichte Northrup. She is survived by her daughter, Anita Macaya (Rafael); son, Mark Northrup (Magdalena); sisters, Marilyn Hart and Mildred McKittrick; 8 grandchildren; and 13 great-grandchildren.
