



## Nancy Emma Ray Pawel

February 14, 1928 - July 15, 2021

Nancy Emma Ray Pawel passed away peacefully surrounded by her loving family on Thursday, July 15, 2021 at the age of 93. Nancy's family will miss their Oma dearly and will cherish her memory always.

Nancy was born in Boston, Massachusetts on Valentine's Day, February 14, 1928 to Anna Urban and Carlon Weston Ray. Her family descended from both Myles Standish and John Alden, passengers on the Mayflower. Graduating with a degree in Chemistry and a Minor in Art History from Wellesley College, she was also known around campus for her "joie de vivre" and later proudly giggled about her picture in a swimsuit in *Cosmopolitan*. After graduation, she worked at Tufts University Medical School, and in 1951 in Newton, MA she married Thomas Ernst Pawel, who she had met a few years earlier at a Harvard Business School mixer. Together, they moved to San Antonio where she did biochemical research at the School of Aviation Medicine, which at the time was at Randolph Air Force Base.

After quitting her job to become a mother, she started taking art classes at the McNay Art Institute where, given her chemistry background, she became fascinated with fired glazes for her stoneware and porcelain creations. In 1969, Nancy was offered an Art faculty position at University of the Incarnate Word (UIW), where she taught beginning and advanced ceramics for 32 years and where she studied for and received her Master's Degree. Nancy's basement "Pot Shop" was a special place. She loved her students both young and old. She thrived mentoring them in art and life, and always loved seeing them long after graduation.

Nancy is widely known for her collectible castles, ladies, celadon bowls as well as her public commissions which could be viewed across the area at the San Antonio Botanical Center, Hilton Palacio del Rio, Saint Mary's Hall, Kelly Air Force Base, two Morningside Ministries Communities, including the Chandler Estate, the Natatorium at UIW, and several large Texas ranches. She won numerous awards and participated in many juried shows, including The Taipei Cultural Center in Taiwan. Her awards included San Antonio Express News "Outstanding Woman in Art" and "Artist of the Year" by the San Antonio Art League, as well as the featured artist of the National Council of Jewish Women and recipient of the San Antonio Conservation Society Lynn Ford Craftsman Award. She was

honored to be selected and participated with other clay artists from around the world in the First International Ceramic Artist Workshop in Ichon, South Korea and was a delegate to the World Craft Council in Kyoto, Japan.

In addition to her career in art which has spanned over six decades, Nancy along with her husband Tom, founded Concord Oil Company in 1956. In 1986 Concord donated 1,500 acres in West Bexar County to Texas Research & Technology Foundation (TRTF) to build the Texas Research Park. The endowment funding TRTF operations is now named the Nancy & Tom Pawel Endowment.

Nancy enjoyed people and parties. She was a member of many civic, social and art organizations throughout her lifetime, including the Junior League, Wellesley Club, Forum, Timely Topics, History Club, San Antonio Country Club, Argyle, San Antonio Art League and San Antonio Potters Guild.

Special thanks and recognition are extended to Cristina, Blair, Lena, Michael, and niece Caroline whose support has been so critical in these past few years. The Pawel family are thankful for wonderful caregivers, most recently Debbie, Jennifer, Letty, Nora, Lisa R., Millie and Casey. The advice of Dr. Scott Campbell and Nurse Lisa was so important and gave us great comfort. We are appreciative of Peter Stainken who kept the house humming, and so indebted to so many others. It truly has taken a village.

Nancy was preceded in death by her husband of almost 53 years, Tom Pawel. We believe they are now dancing together again as they so loved to do. Nancy is survived by her three daughters and five grandchildren; daughters, Margaret Pawel and husband Tom Stewart, Elizabeth (Lisa) Pawel and husband Rick Schlesinger, and Charlotte Pawel; grandchildren, Zachary Pawel Schlesinger, Margaret Elizabeth (M.E.) Jonas, William James Jonas, IV, Myles Standish Jonas and Alden Anderegg Jonas. Nancy is also survived by her amazing Concord/Newton family.

After a private interment, a Memorial Service to celebrate Nancy's Life will be held at St. David's Episcopal Church at 1300 Wiltshire on Saturday, August 14 at 2 pm with a gathering following at a different location to be announced later.
