“ I had know Randy for over 35 years and 25 of those years in the Children's ministries at Trinity Baptist Church. As I came on staff, Randy was one of the first volunteers that I met. Randy was always the first to volunteer for any activities of the Children's ministries.

Randy's favorite event was Preteen Camp. He loved being with the kids on a longer extended period that was not possible when teaching Sunday School. Randy was sensitive to the children who stay on the fringes and seem to need a little more support. I could always find Randy and a child sitting outside on a bench just talking. He was able to share with them about his own beginnings and the great way God worked out his life.

Randy also had a disability, one that was not visible. This gave him a keen awareness of kids who were struggling in learning or accomplishing skills. He could give them encouragement and guidance. He would frequently tell me that a certain child needed help in this area or that area. Randy was like a secret weapon, I would see a child who needed extra time and I would send in Randy. When Randy started think about going back to school and getting his degree in counseling, he asked me what I thought. "Randy, you have that kind of personality this is laid back and gentle, very useful when talking with children. You have a heart for children and a desire to help them to be better people. You need to do what makes you happy, knowing that this is the plan God has for you". And he did!
