Rudy took the ROTC & Military route, while I took the sports and education route. We both graduated from Nixon in 1983. Rudy enter the US Army while I went to college. We both kinda went our both ways from that point, but when i would visit from UTSA, Rudy, his ex-brother-in-law, David and I would get together at David and Rudy's sister Rosario's house which right next to Tomasita's house.
