Albert Orien Kuykendall was born in Jourdanton, Texas on August 14, 1920 and went to be with the Lord on August 18, 2008. He was a sixth generation Texan, a fact of which he was very proud. His family was one of the original 300 who settled Texas with Stephen F. Austin. The Kuykendall family was given a land grant by Stephen F. Austin in 1824. They eventually settled in Tilden, Texas. He was preceded in death by his wife of 65 years, Billie. He is survived by his daughter, Abbie Morgan and son Mike Kuykendall as well as his sister Lois Rathburn. He was also survived by four grandchildren, April Jonas, Kirk Bennett, Bret Bennett and Michael Kuykendall. He also had five great grandchildren, Jared and Jenna Kuykendall, Braiden and Blaine Bennett and Sofia Bennett. He was one of four children, three of whom have pre-deceased him. He had many nieces and nephews.

Orien served his county with honor during World War II and then entered into a long career in the livestock business. He was a livestock buyer for several companies over his long career, primarily with Swift and Company. After he retired, he continued to buy and sell cattle for many years.

Orien enjoyed hunting, fishing and in his earlier years golf. He never passed up a good game of cards with his old friends from the stockyards. His many years in the livestock business provided him with life long friends whom he still cherished to this date.

During his lifetime, he worked long and hard hours to provide for his family and inspired them to always do their best and will be remembered with great love.
