Alberto Leonardo Belalcazar M.D., passed from this Earth on January 9, 2020. He was born on March 23, 1953 in Bogota, Colombia and immigrated to the United States to pursue his education when he was 18. He obtained a Bachelor's degrees in Physics and Mathematics and then went to Medical School followed by an internship in Puerto Rico, his residency in New York, ultimately becoming a General and Vascular Surgeon in his home state of Texas where he resided and practiced medicine for several decades. He transitioned into becoming a Cosmetic Surgeon and opened a Medical Spa. In 1986, he received the Congressional Medal of Honor for saving the life of a 3 year old child. He had a passion for helping others and practicing medicine.

He is preceded in death by his beloved parents, Luz and Alonso Belalcazar, and is now reunited with them for eternity.
