Deputy Alfonso Tre Machado was born on July 20, 1998 in San Antonio, Texas to Alfonso A. and Naomi J. Machado. He passed away on October 18, 2019 after a valiant battle with cancer at the age of 21. Tre loved playing sports including football, baseball and basketball. He enjoyed having game nights with his family with various board games and had a blast as long as his Dad did not win as he was extremely competitive yet made jokes and fun the entire night and refused to go to sleep unless he was the victor. He loved his family unconditionally. He had a different bond with each member. His father was his hero, his brother was his best friend and thunder buddy. He knew he had a duty to take care of his little sisters which included teaching them right from wrong as well as their buddy to play with. Tre also loved to scare people and no one was more skittish than his mother. Laughter and love was the center of Tre's life. He loved family parties, movie nights, and dining at his favorite restaurants with his family. Watching his brother and sisters play sports while critiquing each game, Fishing with his father, being on the water, and talking police scenarios with his Dad where things he loved and his family will always fondly cherish. He strived to be like his father and followed in his footsteps and became a Deputy. In college, Tre studied Criminal Justice and

took Law Enforcement classes as his elective in all 4 years of high school. Lastly, Tre enjoyed gaming online with his high school group of friends. He looked forward to a long career in Law Enforcement. A great friend of his left us with this, "Your son is a very special person. He is nice, funny, and respectful. Just looking into his eyes, I can see he is a sweet young man. I have never seen him cocky or rude. There are two kinds of people who wear the uniform. The first are the ones who wear it to get respect or prestige, and then there are the ones that give prestige to the uniform...your son was the second kind." Those words sat with the family as that is the boy they raised.

A graduate of Somerset High School in 2016, he was able to play in the State playoffs and his still wore his shirts. He played football, track, basketball and baseball since the age of 3. Right after high school, he worked at Whataburger. His mind without a doubt was set on Law Enforcement and for him, the sooner the better. Later attended Palo Alto College studying Criminal Justice. Tre decided to pursue a career in Law Enforcement and joined the Bexar County Sheriff's Department on September 11, 2017. He had a dream to always reach for the next step along the way and that was joining the SERT Team (Special Emergency Response Team) in his field. He felt at home when at work, loved his co-workers, loved the job, and felt he was making a difference...the camaraderie was like no other.

He is survived by his parents, Alfonso A. Machado and Naomi J. 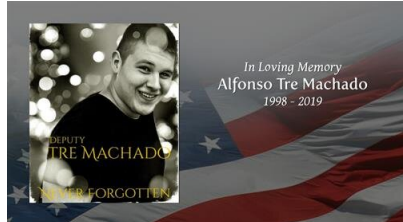
