Allyne R. Shepperd, 100 years, nine months, one day, died peacefully in her sleep under hospice care at Morningside Manor. Born April 20, 1910 in Paris, Texas, she graduated from Taft High School and worked as a bookkeeper in San Antonio. She was married in 1932 to her devoted husband, Harold D. Shepperd. They moved to Colorado in 1947 where she continued work until her retirement. She enjoyed sports, fishing, hunting and camping in the mountains. After retirement, the couple moved to Monrovia, Liberia, West Africa to work for U.S AID and later back to Rockport where Harold died in 1974. A devoted family member she was one of six sisters who predeceased her. She is survived by her son, Donald W. Shepperd, a grandson, Tyler W. Shepperd, great grandchildren, Paige, Christian and Isabelle Shepperd, all of Tucson AZ, and numerous loving nephews and nieces spread throughout south Texas.
