Ana Maria Hernandez, born 26 July 1913 in Nuevo Laredo, Mexico, passed away at 7:45 AM on Friday, 9 December 2005 in San Antonio, Texas. She was preceded in death by her husband, retired U.S.A.F. Msgt. Raul J. Hernandez, her parents Andres L. and Rosenda Stein Salazar, brother Leopoldo Salazar and sisters Gaudalupe Zepeda and Consuelo McDonnell. In 1931, Ana graduated Valedictorian from Brackenridge High School. On 26 December 1945, she married Raul J.
