She loved shopping, boy did she love shopping! She had so many shoes and dresses that she could've opened a store.

Her last words to her daughter Delia and Son "Tino" were "Hijos, ganen muchas almas para el Señor porque Cristo viene pronto. Sean Fiel hasta la muerte!"
