Annie Vivian Loftin was peacefully called to Heaven on December 13, 2020 in Dallas, Texas at 93 years of age. She was born in San Antonio, Texas on June 5th 1927 to Lucy Williams and William “Bill” Loftin. As the eighth of ten children, Annie grew up surrounded by activity and love. She was dedicated to her parents and her siblings and shared many happy stories of their life at 208 Denver Avenue.

A bright and hardworking student, Annie was valedictorian of her class at Brackenridge High School and went on to receive her Bachelor’s degree from Our Lady of the Lake University and her Master’s degree from Trinity University, all in San Antonio, Texas. Her teaching career began in San Antonio and then took her to Houston where she spent many years teaching in the HISD. Annie worked one on one with students who could not attend school through the homebound teaching program. She was an esteemed and dedicated educator until retirement.

Annie had a great love of travel and visited many places in the U.S. (including Hawaii and Alaska), Europe, Russia, Mexico, South and Central America. Her travel partners were usually members of her family. In later years she enjoyed many cruises with her sisters Lucy and Betty.

Annie was sometimes shy but her sense of humor and her intelligent wit were

loved by all who knew her. She was a loving and generous person who took care of many. She was well loved.

Annie is survived by her sister Betty J. Yancey and 3 generations of nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her beloved parents and her siblings: William D. Loftin Jr, Naylor M. Loftin, Reagan P. Loftin, Landrum J. Loftin, Thomas W. Loftin, Lucy I. Ray, Winnie Mae Woods, and Nora Bell Loftin.
