Eugene (Tony) was one great friend and brother. I was 5yo when my brothers would get together in front of our house in Kanosh, Utah, to play softball. I looked up to all of my brothers. Eugene would take me places. Even after we moved up to Kaysville, Utah. Eugene worked at Hill Air Force Base. He had an office and had his own secretary. While Dad worked on the aircraft. Then Eugene joined the USAF and had to go to a base down in California for his training. Dad took the family down to Eugene's graduation. That was a lot of fun.

Eugene never did go on a mission for the LDS church. But he did go up into the north part of Arkansas to do missionary work.

Eugene told us that the General of the air force ordered that all of the B58's missions not to exceed 1600 miles per hour because the decals would burn off and it would take a week to pant them back on the aircraft. Eugene told me that the B58 would fly at mock 3. I ask Eugene if he ever did. He said that he did on a bombing run from Canada down to Edwards air force base. That over a 1000 miles and he did it in 44 min. Because the colonel who was the pilot said to heck with the General and put the speed lever up all the way. And flew up to 65,000 feet. The mission was to avoid being detected by radar. The ground control did not detect them, until they got down to Edwards air force base.
