Ardell Weber, age 94, passed away on Friday evening, August 16th, surrounded by her family. She is preceded in death by her husband of 60 years, Jim Weber, as well as her parents, sister and brother. Born January 9th, 1925, in Nebraska City, Nebraska, the family soon moved to Lincoln, Nebraska where she graduated from High School. It was then, in 1945, that she met and married the love of her life, Jim Weber. Ardell is survived by her 4 children, Tim Weber, Laurie Harris (Don), Todd Weber (Leslie), Jill Arnold (Rusty), 9 grandchildren and 18 great grandchildren. Ardell had a natural talent of that of a sales-person, and started a long successful career in Tupperware in the late 1950s. In 1961, Jim joined her in Tupperware, and they were then promoted to Tupperware Distributors in Topeka, Kansas. After 9 years as distributors in both Kansas and Florida, they were promoted to a Regional Vice President position, which landed them in San Antonio, Texas in 1971. Upon moving to the San Antonio area, the Webers settled into Castle Hills where Ardell became very involved in the Woman's Club, the Garden Club, The San Antonio Breakfast Club and just about any other organization she could participate in. She also was a longtime and active member of Wayside Chapel. Ardell was a strong, kind, generous, caring lady who believed the best in people and was an avid encourager to all. Ardell's greatest love was the love she had for her family, as her family is what brought her the most joy in her life. Whether at home or her beloved lake house, or anywhere, it didn't matter as long as she was surrounded by her family. Her

legacy of love will remain forever, in her family's hearts and homes.
