He was a beloved educator, counselor, husband, and father. He attended Texas State University where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree. It was at then Southwest Texas State, too, he fondly remembered, where he encountered and chatted with President Lyndon Johnson on one of the President's last visits to their alma mater.

"Mr. P," as he was called by his students and colleagues, earned his Master's in Education in 1971 . He was a Licensed Professional Counselor and

became a LPC Supervisor while studying at Trinity University.

He began his career as an educator teaching Civics at Wrenn Middle School and spent over twenty years as a guidance counselor at Edgewood High School, John F. Kennedy High School, and Harlandale Middle School. He inspired and motivated three generations of students, many of whom would visit him over the years to introduce their families and share their memories and accomplishments.

In his final years after he retired from public education he was owner of a private counseling practice in the Park North area and was in the process of moving to a new location when he died. He was a volunteer mediator for over ten years at the Bexar County Dispute Resolution Center. He will be dearly missed by friends and colleagues in the education, justice, and mental health communities.
