A few years later, she was named Mrs. San Antonio and competed in the Mrs. Texas pageant. She joined Cornerstone Church and found her passion teaching in the children's ministry. That continued in various positions up through the end of 2020. She loved teaching children.

Although she never returned to Speech Therapy, she did find a way to use and enhance her speech training. She joined Toastmasters International and began learning how to improve her public speaking skills. She advanced quickly through the levels and loved helping others improve their speaking

skills.

When she was not working in the ministry or speaking, she found rest and relaxation at home with the family whom she really loved. She leaves behind her husband David Scott, II, son Donovan Scott, mother Mrs Dorothy Carter, sisters Linda Carter and Quiteen Graber, and a host of aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces and nephews.
