He was born in Saspanco, TX on February 17, 1926, where he grew up hunting and fishing on his beloved grandfather’s farm whom he referred to as “Papa Grande” He was always telling stories of the things he learned from his grandfather about the land, farming, and tending to his cattle. He served in the US Navy during WWII on the Battleship USS Massachusetts of which he was very proud and telling us that they fired “the first sixteen-inch shell to open the European offensive and firing the last big naval bullet in the Pacific Campaign”. He traveled to Casa Blanca, the Philippines, during the war, but what he loved best was being on his tractor plowing his fields or tending to his beloved roosters. He was considered a legend with his game cocks all over Mexico traveling all over and going to places he’d been to during the war and then with his roosters to Guam, the Philippines, and his beloved Mexico. The sun will never set on his roosters. He was a loving husband, father and grandfather. He was preceded in death by his wife Sulema, parents Juan and Lupe Amalia Gutierrez, brothers Johnny “Tiger” and Elisandro Gutierrez.
