Aurora Elizondo Dyer was born on January 27, 1925 in San Antonio. She attended Hidalgo School on Dora Street and in the 8th grade helped in the family grocery store on Pearl Street. She attended Draughon's Business College in San Antonio, graduating in 1942 as a stenographer.

She began working in 1943 for Kelly Air Force Base. Aurora resigned in 1944 to marry Robert T. Dyer. She returned to work at Kelly Air Force Base in 1953, serving as a supply clerk and secretary in the Special Weapons Directorate. In the 1950's she served as a Girl Scout Leader at St. Joseph's Catholic Church and volunteered for the Red Cross as a Grey Lady at Lackland Air Force Base Hospital.

After retirement, Aurora traveled to Europe in 1975 and to South America in 1976. She loved driving in her car, visiting relatives and helping family members. Aurora lived a life of service and dedication to others.
