Barbara Crenwelge Eickman, born July 20, 1943 in Fredericksburg, Texas passed away on November 16, 2020 at the age of 77 years. She was the daughter of Hubert and Norma Crenwelge (nee Kolmeier) who preceded her in death. She graduated from Thomas Jefferson High School in San Antonio, Texas in 1961. She attended San Antonio College before becoming a secretary/bookkeeper. She met married her husband, Charles, in 1968 and they were married in 1969. He preceded her in death in December 2007. She was a long-time member of Shepherd King Lutheran Church serving on various committees and the church council. She was proud to serve in the capacity of Church Council President for 2 different terms and as recently as this past September when she resigned due to her failing health. She was also a member of their handbell choir where she loved to make music. During her daughter's years in high school, she was an active member of the Churchill High School Band Parent Association. She and her husband also had a successful tire retreading business, Quality Retreads, during the 1980s and 1990s. She was also a member of the Willow City Community Club in Willow City, Texas. Barbara was also member of several Bunco clubs, the Hidden Forest Garden Club, and loved to play Skip-Bo with friends. In addition to her parents and husband, Barbara was preceded in death by her sister Carol Sue Crenwelge in 2018. Barbara is survived by her two daughters, Stephanie Hernandez (Pete) and Cheryl Stokes (Brad) and two stepdaughters Melanie Snyder and Melissa Landers (Bryan). She is also

survived by 3 grandchildren, Hannah and Emily Stokes and Seth Hernandez and 2 nephews Jeff Wurzbach (Tiffany) and Greg Wurzbach.
