



## Bertie Frances Eiserloh

September 21, 1931 - December 28, 2022

Frances (Fran) Taylor Eiserloh was called home by the Lord December 28, 2022, at the age of 91 in San Antonio, Texas. She was born in Tennessee in 1931 to Floyd Taylor and Elsie Byers Taylor and has been a resident of San Antonio since 1939. Fran was preceded in death by her loving husband of 64 years, Harold Lee Eiserloh, her parents Floyd and Elsie Taylor, brother Captain William Humphrey USN, Ret., nephews Quentin Humphrey and Peter Eiserloh. She is survived by nieces Marianne Humphrey Paull (Larry), Mitzy Eiserloh Stoliker (Gary), Karen Eiserloh, and nephews Paul Eiserloh (Richard) and Alex Eiserloh (Lou).

Fran graduated from Harlandale High School in 1946 at the age of 15. She became a registered Medical Laboratory Technologist at the age of 18 after earning an Associate degree at San Antonio College. She then earned a Bachelor of Science in Biology degree and a Master of Science in Biology degree from Trinity University in San Antonio. Fran was a member and past President of both the San Antonio and Texas Societies of Medical Laboratory Technologists and a leader of their Traveling Seminar Team. She spent 23 years in private and hospital laboratories before leaving to join the faculty of Allied Health Department at The University of Texas Health Science Center in San Antonio teaching medical laboratory subjects. She then spent 23 years as a professor at St. Philips College before retiring in 1994.

Since 1946, she was an active member of the First Baptist Church of San Antonio and member of Greater San Antonio Camera Club. In 1975 Fran

founded the Alamo City Cat Club avidly breeding Persian, Siamese, and traditional Burmese cats. She showed Grand Champion and Regional winners to CFA promoting breeds, preserving and improving them. Fran presided over the club as President and later Treasurer until 2020.
