Betty Anderson was born August 16, 1938, in Pearsall, Texas to Charles Henry and Della Rosenauer. She passed away at the age of 86. Charlie and Della Rosenauer started their family in 1920.

There was a 14-year gap between their daughters Liz and Betty. Betty was born in the Goodnight Hospital on August 16, 1938, in Pearsall, Texas. Betty was the whole family's favorite. She was beautiful, smart, and compassionate as told by Linda Rosanauer Sweet, Betty's oldest niece and Charles Edward's oldest child. They were born 5 years apart. As a young teen, she began embracing her natural love for being a caretaker. She continued being the family caregiver until her husband and soulmate passed away in 2016.

She met Charles when he was 15 and she was 14. They were soulmates. She married Charles B. Anderson in the Pearsall Baptist Church on March 31, 1957, and were married for 59 years. She was very active in Mayfield Park Baptist Church where she taught Sunday School for 4 decades. She was active in the San Antonio Community, a Girl Scout Leader, Day Camp Director, and G.S. Council Committee Member. She taught Arts and Crafts at Day Camps, was active with PTA elected positions for 7 years, the last two at McCollum High School as PTA President from 1980 – 1982. She owned Betty's Bridal Boutique for at least 10 years, starting in 1977. She made Bridal Gowns and Bridesmaids dresses as well as silk flower bouquets. From the

1960's through the 1990's she grew African Violets in the windows of the Kitchen and Livingroom. They were beautiful and she had quite a green thumb. After her daughters, the Violets were her joy.

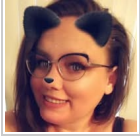

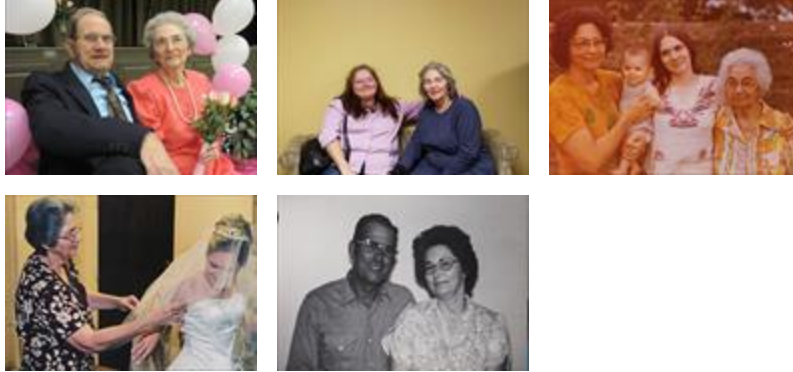
