



## Betty Byrd Brown Lewis

December 26, 1924 - December 5, 2020

Betty Byrd Lewis passed away Saturday, December 5, 2020 at the age of 95. She was born in Dallas Texas, graduated from Adamson High School (class of 1941) and attended secretarial college. She married W. Frank Lewis in October, 1945; they were married 61 years until his death in 2007. The family moved to San Antonio in 1957. Besides her long service as a homemaker, she had a long-lasting interest in genealogical research and World War II history, and tended her many plants.
