Betty Jo Stone was born October 10, 1920 in Newellton, Louisiana. She is preceded in death by her parents, Josephine and Oliver H. Love Sr. and her brother, Oliver H. Love, Jr., (Bubba). She graduated from Newellton High School and went on to study at Louisiana State University, Tyler Commercial College and received a degree from Texas University in Austin, Texas and also was a TA while working on her Masters degree.

During WWII, at the age of 18, she was the Chief Clerk of Tensas Parish Selective Service. She then married Rev. James F. Stone and became a Methodist Minister's wife and worked along with her husband in Farmersville, Alexandria, Shreveport, and Baton Rouge Louisiana. Betty Jo and Jim moved to Texas and served at Three Rivers, Austin, Weslaco and McAllen churches. When her husband moved to the Episcopal Church, she taught school in McAllen, at UT, Corpus Christi, and Robert E. Lee High School in San Antonio.

BJ is survived by her daughters, Judy Culp and Elissa York, son-in-law Ronald K. Culp, four grandchildren: Nathan, Cheryl, Tom and Brent and seven great-grandchildren: Lydia, Sophia, Madeline, Trey, Thaddeus, Ryan and Alexa.

BJ moved to the Meadows of Morningside Ministries in 2003 where she made new friends, shared memories with old friends and made a new home for

herself. She served as the Librarian for ten years and spent time in book clubs, playing bridge, attending Bible Study and visiting with her family and friends.

Due to a fall, she recently moved to The Manor section of Morningside. Thursday morning, March 23, 2017, she went home to be with her savior, Jesus Christ.
