COL Bruce E. Stansbury USAF Ret. passed away March 6, 2011 in San Antonio, TX at the age of 86. He was born in Twin Falls, Idaho to Murrel and Mary Stansbury who preceded him in death. Bruce enlisted in the Army Air Corps in 1942 and served as a liaison pilot in WWII. When the war ended, he went to college on the G.I. bill and received his dental degree from Northwestern University. He rejoined the Air Force as a dental officer, gaining a masters degree from the university of Michigan in prosthetic dentistry. He retired from the Air Force in 1974 after 24 years of service. He was then in private practice in San Antonio for more than 20 years. He was preceded in death by his wife, Janet Stansbury and a sister Susan Fordyce. He is survived by his son, Lee Stansbury and wife Virginia, sister, Carol Gould; brother, Robert Stansbury; 2 granddaughters, Caroline and Margaret Stansbury; and 6 nieces and nephews.
