



Carol Schad

December 25, 1939 - February 20, 2018

Born in San Antonio, Texas, on December 25, 1939, to Lillian and Robert Boothe. Grew up on Southside, attended Gerald Elementary and Harlandale Junior High. Moved to Austin with family for one year in 1954; moved back to San Antonio's northside and attended Edison High School, graduating in 1958. Attended Texas Woman's University for one year, earning a One-year business certificate. While at TWU, was in Alpha Lambda Delta National Honor Society and Omega Rho Alpha English Honor Society for Freshmen. Roommate at TWU was Anita Crowell (McDaniel), best friend from Edison HS. While on Spring Break in San Antonio, Second best friend, Karen Rock (Ellis) introduced her to Don Schad who was stationed at Randolph AFB. Upon returning to San Antonio after one year at TWU, went to work for Civil Service at BAMC, Dispositions Office. After several months of dating, Don and Carol were married on September 5, 1959. They purchased their first home in Universal City in 1962, then received orders to be stationed at Wheeler AFB, Wahiawa, Hawaii, in 1964. Carol worked for Civil Service at Wheeler.

Carol and Don adopted their first child, a girl, 1 month old, in June 1965. They named her Lezley Dawn Leilani. Carol resigned from her Secretarial job to be a stay-at-home mom. In March 1967, Carol and Don adopted a second Daughter, 2 months old. They named her Sheri Lynn Nani. In August, Don received orders to go to Vandenberg AFB in northern California. In 1968, Carol became pregnant with third daughter, Michele Lee, who was born that

December in San Antonio. Don was transferred to Shepler AFB in Wichita Falls, TX in January 1969. The family returned to Randolph AFB in San Antonio in May 1972 and bought their second home. While in Hawaii, Carol took Polynesian dancing. This was her introduction to the world of dancing. She and Don became Square dancers and joined the Astro Twirlers where they were members for over 20 years. Carol and Don took Country-Western dance lessons. They square danced on Wednesday Nights and country-western danced on weekends. They made many good friends in the Astro Twirlers and went on trips with several couples.

Carol became interested in Line Dancing and took lessons in 1991. She was asked to help form a line dance competition Team. She named the team The Texas Twisters and was their leader/captain for 14 ½ Years until the team dissolved in 2010 due to health reasons. While in competition, the Team earned first place in Houston and first place in Dallas for their routine to “All My Rowdy Friends” which was choreographed by Twoosie, who formed the team. Because of The stress of competing and the expenses, the Team decided to just perform for organizations In San Antonio and surrounding cities. They performed many years at Schertz Fourth of July event, Hermann Sons Fiesta event, The Harp and Shamrock’s St Patrick’s Day event at The Arneson Theatre, on stages on the San Antonio Stock Show & Rodeo grounds, Lone- some Dove festival in Karnes City.

Carol was preceded in death by her father in 1980, Robert, by her husband Don, in 2000, her mother Lillian in 2003, her daughter Sheri, in 2009, many aunts, uncles and cousins and many dear friends.
