For those who didn't know her, please allow me to tell you about her.

She was incredibly talented and was an entrepreneur. She used to sit outside at a stand in the market downtown and paint parasols for little girls with their name and a figure of their choice. (She had an amazing tan!) She then opened her own shop called "Nanny's Nook" and filled it with clothes and jewelry that she made along with other speciality items. Her signature clothing was Mother/Daughter rompers. After closing her shop, she continued to sew and make jewelry and turned to local market shows. She then started making jewelry full time and sold at market shows for years. She eventually narrowed it down to home shows and shows at her living community and continued her jewelry making until recent years. Of course, my Father-in-Law was by her side during all of her endeavors and was her "right hand man".

Among other things, she made us curtains, pillows and a king size mountain-themed comforter for our 1st house in Colorado. She and my Mom made Aubrey's crib bedding. It was precious and meant so much to me.

In addition, she was an amazing cook! She had several traditional foods that we always looked forward to. (her ginger snaps are a favorite)! We spent several years decorating Christmas cookies at her house with our kids and cousins. I have a treasured family cookbook full of recipes that she handed down to me (and all the girls in the family). Her house was always a home and ready for a visit anytime and she was able to whip up something to serve on a moment's notice.

Family time often included card games and one of our family favorites was Rumikub.

She had six children in 10 years. So, to say she was strong is an understatement.

At some point early in mine and Chris's relationship, I called her

"Mama C" and it stuck, so from that point forward, any card she gave me was signed "Mama C".

She and my Father-in-Law were a usual presence at Chandler's football and baseball games and Aubrey's various dance activities. They somehow always managed to balance time with their eight school-age grandkids that lived in the area.

She was a confidant and openly shared words of wisdom, always sprinkled with lots of love. I valued her opinion and respected her perspective. She had impeccable style and of course, always had handmade matching jewelry for her bright, colorful tops. She was feisty and fought for what she valued - especially her family. Her heart was pure and it wasn't unusual for her to tear up with overflowing love when expressing her feelings or when we expressed ours. She was a strong, compassionate woman of faith. I am incredibly blessed to have her as my Mother-In-Law. I never doubted how much she loved me. I pray that I can be to my future son and daughter-in-law what she was to me💖

She and my Father-in-Law, the love of her life, inspired us all with their marriage. After 61 years in, it wasn't perfect, but they always prioritized each other and set an example of love and patience.

She battled various health issues over the last couple of years. But, in typical Carolyn style, she put up one heck of a fight! All five siblings and my Father-in-Law were by her side to say goodbye and release her into Jesus's arms🙏 I find great comfort thinking about how absolutely giddy she was meeting Jesus and getting to be with her daughter Tracy, who met Him in 2012.
