CHARLES CLAYTON KENYON

Charles C. Kenyon, age 91, went into the care of the Lord on March 13, 2010. He was born on June 28, 1918 in Chicago, Illinois. He married Mary Elizabeth Dyer in Brownwood, Texas in October of 1945. He leaves his beloved wife and children, Mary Lynne Barrow, Charles W. Kenyon, Carol Bierschwale and Rick Bierschwale, as well as four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He graduated from Harlandale High School, San Antonio, Texas. He joined the 36th Infantry Division, Texas National Guard, prior to WWII. He trained with the division at Camp Bowie outside of Brownwood, Texas where he met his future wife. With the 36th, he served in North Africa before invading Southern Italy in September, 1943 under heavy enemy fire. Next was the invasion of Southern France in support of the Normandy invasion. Mr. Kenyon also served in Germany and Austria and was part of the allied occupation forces. He was assigned to to the 111th Medical Detachment and was detached to the 133rd Field Artillery. When the war ended , Mr. Kenyon returned to Texas and was married. He and his bride made their home in San Antonio, Texas. Upon discharge, he became an apprentice electrician, joining the IBEW Local Union #60. He later joined the Civil Service at Kelly Air Force Base from which he retired. He was a long-time member of the Sons of Hermann. He was an active member of Harlandale Presbyterian Church, Crestholme Presbyterian Church and then San Pedro Presbyterian Church.
