Deacon Clayton A. Mangold, beloved husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather, went home to be with the Lord Sunday, May 13, 2007 at the age of 84. Clayton was born on November 22, 1922, in Cliff, Texas. Raised in Medina County, he was the second of three boys. He was a member of the Fightin' Texas Aggie Class of '47 and a member of the Troop "B" Cavalry. While attending college, he served in the Army of the United States as First Lieutenant 0-539 861 Cavalry from December 31, 1943 to May 3, 1946. He began his career with Sears Roebuck and Company as a Service Manager for 27 years. Clayton retired from Sears and became a Deacon in 1980. He spent less than one year in retirement before serving as the Finance Coordinator at St. Paul's Catholic School for 10 years. His hobbies included boating, fishing, hunting and having a good time with family and friends. Clayton was quite the character and enjoyed sharing his Aggie jokes. His humility and willingness to help others in need is what Clayton was all about. His greatest accomplishment was his family. He always wanted the best for them and strived to make that possible. His sense of humor was truly unique and carries on through his survivors. He was preceded in death by his parents Alfred N. Mangold and Cornelia Wurzbach Mangold and brothers Clyde H. and Larry R. Mangold. Clayton and Macell Burkhalter Mangold were married for 63 years and raised four children Judy Terry Breaux, Gary Judy Mangold,
