



## Clementine Amondi

September 4, 1959 - February 13, 2020

Late Mrs. Clementine Ayodele was born September 4th, 1959 to the Late Archdeacon Cornelius Ojo Olowomeye and Mrs. Victoria Adenike Olowomeye both from Ilawe Ekiti, Nigeria. She was the first of 6 children.

She was born by the first pastor from Ilawe Ekiti. She started her service to God as a member of the choir in the Anglican church at the age of 4 and continued in Deeper Life Bible Church till her transition to glory, singing for her Lord. She was born, baptized and confirmed as a Christian in the Anglican church. She took active part in the girls brigade from primary one till secondary school level.

She attended the following elementary schools: St John's Anglican Primary School ,Igbara Oke (1964- 1966), St Stephen's Anglican Primary School, Ikare Akoko (1967-1968), St Stephen's Anglican Primary School, Akure (1968-1969) and later proceeded to the Secondary school, at Igbara Oke Anglican Grammar School, in Igbara Oke, Ondo State, Nigeria (1970 - 1975).

Clementine Amondi started her nursing career at Ile Abiye Hospital Ado-Ekiti in Nigeria in July 1975. The Midwifery school was affiliated with Emmanuel Anglican church Ado-Ekiti and the school was headed by missionaries from overseas. These missionaries incorporated Christian principles in the training program and this supported Clementine's growth in Christianity.

While in the midwifery clinical training program, Clementine could be best described as the Florence Nightingale of her time. She was born to become a nurse with a high interest in the profession. She took her study seriously, she was eager to learn new things, and she was very creative and innovative. These attributes led to her passing her midwifery examination in one attempt. Also, she delivered so many babies within a short time surpassing the requirements for her graduation. She advanced her education at Grand Canyon University, Arizona, USA.

Although Clementine was one of the youngest among her classmates, she still respected her classmates and worked amicably with them. She was a team player, kind, hospitable, and she radiated love and happiness to those around her. She listened carefully to instructions, and obeyed the school laws and regulations, remembering the disciplined home that she came from.

In 1981, she got married to Mr. Jide Amondi and together, they have 4 children.

After her midwifery training, Clementine worked briefly in Nigeria at Ile Abiye Hospital, Ado-Ekiti, Igbobi National Orthopedic hospital, Yaba Lagos (February 1985- January 1989 ), State Hospital Akure, and State Hospital Ado-Ekiti before she migrated to the United States of America in 2003.

She worked at Balmoral Nursing Home in Chicago from December 2003 to June 2014 and in American Home Health, Aurora,IL from December 2009 to November 2011 before relocating to Texas. Worked briefly at United Regional Hospital and Red River Hospital in Wichita Falls, Texas (February 2009 to August 2009). She worked at Texas State Department of Aging and Disability (September 2014 to January 2016) ,San Antonio Behavioral Hospital (April 2014 to September 2018 ) ,San Antonio State Hospital ( January 2016 to April 2016) , Texas State infectious Disease Hospital ( May 2016 to January 2019) and also at San Antonio State Supported Living Center, San Antonio, TX till

February ,2020. She was a devoted and excellent daughter, wife, mother, friend, sibling and nurse. She is survived by an aged mother, husband, four children, six grandchildren and five siblings.

Visitation will be Thursday, March 12, 2020 from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m. with a Prayer Service to begin at 7:00 p.m. at Mission Park Funeral Chapels South. Funeral service will be Friday, March 13, 2020 at 11:00 am. at Mission Park South. Interment to follow at Cordi-Marian Resurrection Cemetery.
