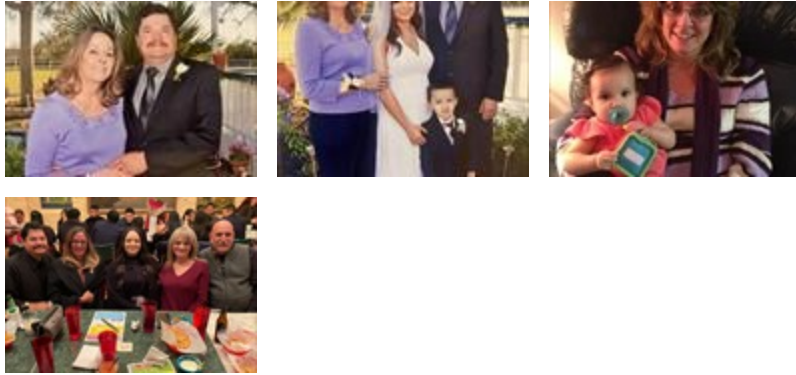

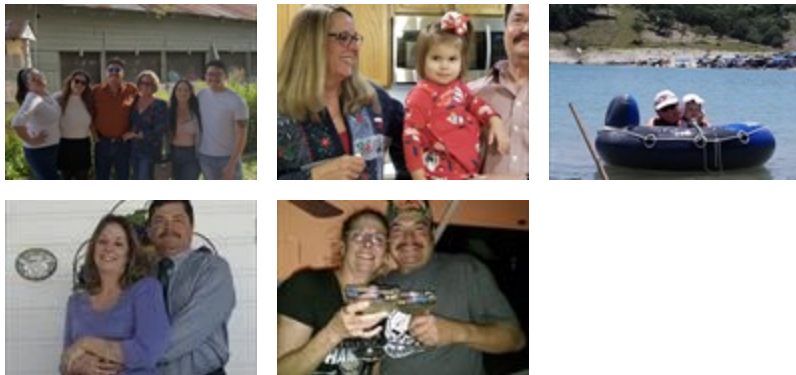

“ To Cindy: Mrs. Hurt's fifth grade class was housed in one of the original 1950's classrooms at St. Gregory's Elementary School- one with two sides of glass windows- some painted (with scratches that the kids could peer through) and some that opened, affording the occasional rare breeze to the post PE-students inside. Every morning, the early risers played a game: lock the doors and hide (stranding the late-comers outside until rescue by "Trinidad" or an impatient sister). The two most coveted hiding places were the plastic trash cans - both reserved for the cool kids. On one morning, one dumpy classmate (who dreamed she would one day be among the "cool") got to one of the trashcans first. With what must have been a Herculean effort, the trashcan was shoved over by an unidentified prefect who reminded the miscreant occupant of her inferior status. The room was silent as I crawled to the coat closet; that is, until Cindy (the poster child of cool) climbed out of her own trash can and insisted I hide there. Fast forward almost 60 years later -I've never forgotten the kindness of a child who had my back and validated me when I needed it most. Hers was a life well-lived, of a generosity and humanity that was hers from birth.
