



## Daniel H. Saucedo

November 11, 1935 - July 5, 2021

Daniel Hernandez Saucedo, age 85, died on Monday, July 5, 2021, with his family present. Dan was born on the Crawford Ranch, San Marcos, Texas, to Guadalupe and Gabriela Saucedo on November 11, 1935. He was one of twelve children and he developed a strong work ethic from his family. In his early school years, he moved to San Antonio, Texas and he graduated from Lanier High School. Daniel then went on to San Antonio College and began to work part-time at the Inman Christian Center, known then as the “MCI” to the many agency participants. Dan received his BA Degree from Trinity University. He served in the U.S. Army Reserves and continued his education, earning a Master’s Degree in Social Work from Our Lady of the Lake University. Following his graduation, Dan began full-time work with children and adolescents at Inman Christian Center and in 1965, he became the Executive Director of the Center, serving 36 years in that position. Through the years leading the Center, he worked with the board, volunteers and staff to establish the programs that would help low-income children, adults and families. Under his leadership, Inman received grants and contracts to provide services in childcare and child development, adolescent substance abuse treatment, contracts to build six apartment complexes for the elderly and for adults with disabilities. After five years in retirement, Dan returned to help the center as a volunteer Executive Director for another five years. Dan was on Inman’s Board of Directors at the time of his death.

While working in his career, he served in many civic groups. Dan was an

active member of the National Association of Social Workers and held the ACSW Credential. He was a member of the Southwest Research Educational Develop Laboratory, serving a term as board president as he also did with the Pan American Optimist Club and the Pan American Little League. He served on the San Antonio Independent District School Board and on the Bexar County Hospital District Board. Daniel was a member of the Nat M. Washer Masonic Lodge #1270 and Lulac Council No. 2.

Dan said he came a little late to the game of golf, but he loved the game and played regularly with groups and in tournaments. He enjoyed the game of football and was an active parent when his sons, Steven and John, were young, transporting a small bus full of players to practice every morning. He always loved working the land and volunteered to help Inman maintain its property. He worked on his small ranch in Bandera with great enjoyment. Daniel met his wife, Judith, in 1962 when she came to work at Inman through its affiliation as a mission center of the Christian Church, Disciples of Christ. They were members of Central Christian Church in San Antonio and were married there in 1964. Dan and Judy worked together at Inman their entire career.

Daniel was preceded in death by his parents and his youngest son, John David. He is survived by his wife Judith and his son Steven and his wife Kellie. A 10:00 AM graveside service will be held on Saturday, July 17, 2021 at Mission Park North Cemetery, 20900 IH 10 West San Antonio, TX 78257. A 2:00 PM memorial service will also be held on Saturday, July 17, 2021 at Central Christian Church, 720 N. Main San Antonio, TX 78205.

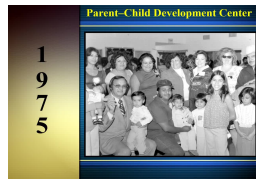
