She worked for 12 years at the San Antonio Lighthouse for the Blind where she was well liked and a valued employee.

She battled breast cancer for 4 years starting with a lumpectomy & radiation

but cancer recurred. She had a mastectomy & chemotherapy but cancer recurred. She was fighting with chemotherapy again. She wanted to recover & return to work. But, she caught Covid-19 which caused kidney failure and her body, weakened by cancer and chemotherapy, couldn't tolerate dialysis and she went to be with the Lord.

She was friendly, happy, gregarious, had a positive attitude, and loved God. She will be missed by her family and many friends. She loved BBQs & parties, strawberries, fried shrimp, ham sandwiches, beef fajita tacos, cucumbers with ranch dip, Folgers coffee and fresh squeezed lemon juice in her ice water. We will always remember her smile, sense of humor, friendliness, and determination to be independent.

Deborah will be cremated. Her daughters plans to divide her ashes into 3 urns. One for each to keep Mom with them, and one to bury near the grave of the beloved grandmother who raised her.
