



Delano P. Ruiz

May 20, 1945 - February 10, 2021

Delano “Ray” Ruiz, 75, beloved husband, brother, and uncle, entered eternal rest on February 10, 2021. He was born on May 20, 1945 in San Antonio, Texas. Mr. Ruiz was a proud US Army Vietnam War veteran. He was a paratrooper with the 101st Airborne Division Company B 3d Battalion (Airborne) 187th Infantry Regiment “Rakkasans”; 82D Airborne Division Company B 2d Battalion 325th Infantry; 173D Airborne Brigade Company B 3d Battalion (Airborne) 503d Infantry.

SSG Ruiz, a decorated Soldier and Hero, earned the Silver Star Medal, Bronze Star Medal (1st Oak Leaf Cluster), Air Medal (1st Oak Leaf Cluster), Army Commendation Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, Noncommissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon with 2 Device, Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal with Device (60-), Parachutist Badge, Combat Infantry Badge, Rifle Sharpshooter Badge, Marksmanship Badge. He enjoyed the open road and traveled across the United States “home of the brave” and Canada as a long-haul truck driver, retiring from TSI Trucking Company. His love of family was strong, quitting school early to assist his Mother and siblings after the sudden death of his Father. He continued helping by giving advice and encouragement through

the years. Mr. Ruiz lived his life with steadfast determination and commitment, a firm “no” or “yes”. He was a jovial and interesting conversationalist with a quick and incredibly humorous wit who never met a stranger. He faced several medical conditions, yet his faith never wavered. Preceded by his parents Domingo and Carolina Ruiz. He was given the name Delano Roosevelt by his mother, who admired the recently deceased President and in keeping with the “D” names. The name “Ray” was given to him, as a young boy, by his father. Survivors: His wife, Maria Q.
