



Delbert C. Singer

June 25, 1919 - September 5, 2005

Delbert Clarence Singer, Sr. passed away on Labor Day, September 5, 2005 as a result of prolonged complications following a fall in January of this year. He died in the loving care of the Audie Murphy Veterans Administration Extended Care Treatment Center, San Antonio, Texas at the age of 86. Delbert was born in Huntington, West Virginia on June 25, 1919 to Alta Carl and Ona Mae Ball Singer. He served his country in the army from 1942-1945 when he moved to San Antonio, Texas to work as an electrical technician for Western Union Telegraph Company until his retirement. During his tenure at Western Union, Delbert was the President of the Union and served on the National Bargaining Committee for many years. Delbert was a Free Mason and a member of the Anchor Masonic Lodge 424 and actively involved with the Alzarar Shrine Temple where he served in the Children's Burn Unit Transportation service, Golf unit, and most notably the Oriental Band. Survivors include four daughters, Pat Peerenboom and husband, Fritz, Sandra Barnett and husband, Harold, Trudell Singer Green, and Jennifer Singer Looper and husband, Terry, as well as one son, his namesake, Delbert C. Singer, Jr. Duke and wife, Cathy; seven brothers and sisters, Lula McCalla, A.C. Singer, Ona Mae Reese, Marie Wechsler, Myrtle Belle Mancini, Max Singer, Gloria Woolwine and two brothers-in-law, Dan Fore and Willard Fore. He was preceded in death by his parents, brother, Donald Singer, sister, Virginia Singer Burcham, his first wife, Dorothy Singer Richards and his second wife of 50 years Trudy Fore Singer. grandchildren, 19 great grandchildren, a multitude of life-long friends and special friend Wanda Daniels, his companion of four years.
