Dolores Ann Parks Horton, 79, died June 23, 2017 at approx 2:50 AM at Warm Springs Hospital, New Braunfels, Texas following a brief illness. The cause of death was from a rare blood disease, Wegener's granulomatosis known as GPA Disease.
