



## Douglas H. Carmichael

August 30, 1931 - May 14, 2025

Douglas Henry Carmichael was born on August 30, 1931 at the Robert B. Green Hospital in San Antonio to Hugh and Eleanor Carmichael. He was baptized and confirmed at St. Mary's Catholic Church. He attended Robert E. Lee elementary, Emerson Jr. High and graduated from Brackenridge in 1949. He joined the Marine Corps reserve while still in high school and upon graduation was sent to Korea. At the age of 19 he was wounded in the battle of the Chosin Reservoir. After returning home he worked for the Southern Pacific Railroad, City Public Service, helped build the dam on Falcon Lake, the Gallagher Ranch in Pipe Creek, and eventually retired from Kelly Field. Doug never married, but was close to his brother, sister and their children. He was very generous helping various non profit organizations, and others who were in need of help. Doug had many friends and was always a southside resident. He will be sorely missed by those of us who are still here. He was preceded in death by his parents Hugh and Eleanor Carmichael, and his sister Virginia Park. He is survived by his brother Don Carmichael of New Iberia Louisiana, his nephews Hugh Carmichael of Kingwood Tx. Mike Park of Johnson City Tx. and niece Patricia Park of Boerne Tx.
