



## Earl E. Cobb Jr.

November 6, 1929 - August 29, 2023

Born November 6, 1929 in San Antonio to Earle and Dorothy Cobb. He attended Woodlawn Elementary, Jorace Mann Junior High, and Thomas Jefferson High School.

Attended UT Austin from 1947-1951. His full college career he was a Longhorn cheerleader two years of which he was head cheerleader. He pledged Phi Gamma Delta and was a member of the Cowboys. He obtained a Bachelor of Arts Degree.

Upon Graduation he enlisted in the Army and served in Berlin with the Counterintelligence Core. He was honorably discharged in 1954.

He attended St. Mary's Law School graduating in 1957 with a Bachelors of Law degree. He served as the assistant DA in San Antonio from 1957-1959, and then he went into private practice until he retired after over 50 years.

He was an accomplished athlete and a noble competitor. He held the City handball championship for 9 years and won numerous golf and tennis tournaments at Oak Hills Country Club and competed statewide.

He loved dance, following in his fathers footsteps, and grew up attending Earle Cobb Dance Studio. With the love of dance comes the love of music, and he played the harmonica, piano, and the accordion.

He was a member of 1st Presbyterian Church and was a regular attendee at the Thursday morning Men's Prayer breakfast.

He died peacefully August 29, 2023 leaving his wife of 63 years, Jane, his children Jeni O'Quinn, Vinetta Rosin and husband Jeff, Leslie Leber, and Patrick Cobb and his wife Melani. He is loved by his 4 grandsons, Berco, Erick, Soren, and Carson and 2 granddaughters, Meliora and Addison, and sister-in-law Ann Smith and her husband Charlie, and several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his parents, Earle Cobb Sr. and Dorothy, and his sister and brother in law, Sandra and Clarence Mabry.
