Edgar H. Ressler SMgt USAF Ret, age 78 died October 25, 2005 after a series of long illnesses. He was married to Kathleen Frances Gardner from Mandan, ND on November 6, 1948. They operated the Summit House Restaurant in 1948 and 1949, which was near the Missouri Memorial Bridge in Bismarck. In 1951, he was activated with the 188th Field Artillery National Guard unit at Ft. Rucker, AL. While serving in Japan in 1952, he enlisted in the US Regular Army and made the military his career. After serving 6 ½ years in the U.S. Army he transferred to the U. S. Air Force where he served 20 years in Air Weather Service until his medical retirement in 1977. He is survived by his wife, Kathleen and three daughters, Devlynn Tanner and husband, Alan of Fairborn, OH, Loretta Mays and husband, Ken of Lewisville, TX, Stephanie Iuliano of San Antonio, TX; sisters, Dorothy Ferk and husband, Dennis of Santa Fe, NM, Eleanor Zrout and husband, Bill of Lisle, IL, Joanne Minervini of Venice, FL, Corinne Holck and husband, Larry of Venice, FL; brother, Clarence Ressler of Venice, FL. He was preceded in death by his parents, Theodore and Mathilda Ressler of Sun City, AZ formerly of Bismarck and one son, Jerome, who was killed in a maritime accident in 1980 while serving with the U.S. Coast Guard. He has been an active Catholic all his life, for 19 years at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Leon Springs, TX, and for 7 years at St. Peters in Boerne, TX before retiring to Patriot Heights in San Antonio.
