She married her husband Wilbert Werner, of Shiner, Texas on March 16, 1947. He joined the Navy, then Air Force, so they moved to various bases throughout the U.S. and Japan.

The enormous love and caring that the Aschenbeck siblings shared for each other was amazing! They would all come by and sit around Edna's kitchen table giggling and laughing for hours.

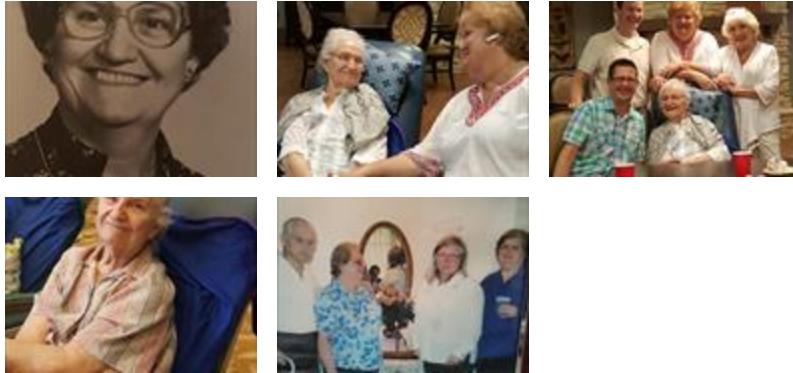
