Eduardo Humberto Moncada, Ed, was 65yrs of age when he passed in his sleep.

He is preceded in death by his father Santiago Moncada and Mother Emma C Moncada. Ed lived in His beloved city of Austin on the shores of Lake Travis. He loved the outdoors, boating, jet skiing, sail boarding and hiking with Max, Gomez and finally Lady, his black Lab.

Ed was one of the sweetest and most loving persons you could have ever met. He cared for his family dearly and loved family gatherings. At these gatherings, his favorite pastime was poking fun at his nieces and nephews, wearing a slight smirk on his face when they caught him.

Ed graduated from Eagle Pass High School in 1974, 2nd in his class, as Salutatorian. His junior year, he was one of fifty in the nation to be selected to attend Colorado School of Minds. He was the 9th Hispanic in the nation and 2nd Hispanic from Eagle Pass, to attended MIT where he studied Electrical Engineering. He started his career in Dallas with Texas Instruments, he later moved to Austin, working for AMD (Advanced Micro Devices) for 18 years, followed later by Samsung Austin Semiconductors to his last day.

Ed fought Cancer for 44 years during his life and always faced challenges with

dignity and honor, he never gave up fighting, researching all his options. A few years after his first bout with cancer he ran and completed the Boston Marathon. Ed possessed an unconquerable spirit and a persistent need to understand the world. He was a faithful friend, lifelong learner, an avid reader, a lover of art, film, and music. Most of all, he was kind.

“ My name is Joe McGowan. I worked with Ed at AMD back in the 80’s. Ed was unique. He was the most responsible, caring individual I have ever been honored to call a friend. I’ll share one of my favorite stories:

*In 1985, I talked Ed into running the New York City Marathon. This was to be his first Marathon. We trained for hours every week building up our endurance to be ready for the race. Early in the training we attended an AMD intramural softball game. While talking to a couple of girls we work with, Ed mentioned with pride, “we are training for the New York City Marathon!”. They dismissed his comment like he was crazy. There was no way someone with Ed’s aerodynamic physique could finish a marathon! Ed didn’t say anything, but I could see Ed’s jaw tighten and the gears turning in his head as he digested that comment. I am pretty sure at that point in time Ed decided failure was not an option!*

*Ed went on to successfully finish the Marathon. He didn’t set any speed records, but the smile on his face was priceless!*

*Anyone that has ever trained for a marathon knows that it requires hours of commitment with difficult challenges to overcome. One of the benefits is training partners learn details about each other, often shared when you are reaching your body’s physical limits.*

*Back in Austin, Tom Vrotsos casually mentioned to me “it is pretty amazing that Ed completed a Marathon, especially when you consider all of the adversity he has encountered in life “. I said, “What are you talking about ?”. He then told me about Ed’s encounter with Cancer at MIT. Ed never mentioned this during months of training together. This tells you everything you need to know about Ed’s character. Ed was not looking for sympathy or pity. That was not Ed’s style. Ed was one of a kind.*
