



Edward Miles Briggs

March 8, 1933 - December 24, 2005

Edward Miles Briggs, 72, passed away peacefully on December 24, 2005. He was born March 8, 1933 to Henry George & Dorothy Tucker Briggs. He was preceded in death by his parents and his brother, Donald Briggs. His family moved to San Antonio in 1939. He graduated from Brackenridge High School & the University of Texas at Austin. He joined Southwest Research Institute as a mechanical engineer, retiring after 39 years in 1998. During his career at SwRI, he was involved in many important projects, especially in the area of the design & testing of underwater vehicles. At the time of his retirement he was the Director of the Department of Marine Technology. He was a member of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers, and in 2003 was nominated by his peers for the ASME Dedicated Service Award as a member of the Pressure Vessel for Human Occupancy Committee from its conception in 1975 until the present, and for recognition of his contribution as chairholder of the committee. He was also a member of the Board of Pressure Technology, Codes and Standards from 1982 to 2001; a member and representative of the Board of Research and Technology from 1992 to 1995; and a member of the Planning Committee Codes and Standards Research from 1998 to 2001. Following his retirement, Ed enjoyed bowling, golfing, fishing, and was renowned for his expertise in gardening, for which he had a real passion. He and his wife also enjoyed traveling. He dearly loved spending time with his grandchildren. Edward is survived by his wife, Mary Jane Briggs, son Roger Briggs and his wife Colleen, and his grandchildren Elyse and Ethan Briggs, all

of San Antonio, and many friends and colleagues.
