He gave his money, time, energy, and love to everyone around him. Oftentimes you could find him helping bathe dogs for his family's business and helping them out however he could. He never seemed to mind much when it came to helping with the animals. He absolutely loved them. From the smallest dog to the largest horse, he was a fan. Edward even owned his own horses and took great care of them up until he was too sick to continue. He loved life and all it had to offer.
