Edward Salomons passed away in San Antonio on January 14, 2009 at the age of 81. He was born in Amsterdam, The Netherlands to a family who had lived in that country since the 1700s. Eddie was a Holocaust survivor and spent most of the Second World War years in concentration camps in Holland and Germany. After his immigration to the U.S., he followed in his family's footsteps and created a successful jewelry manufacturing business; first based in New York and later extended to Puerto Rico and Texas. Eddie was very active in politics and a staunch supporter of Ronald Reagan. For his business ingenuity and participation in politics he was awarded, among other recognitions, the opportunity to represent the United States in Japan in his field. He was also honored by the San Antonio Chamber of Commerce. He is survived by his loving wife of 42 years, Celia Mendez-Salomons; two sons, Steven and Dr. Howard Salomons; his sister, Rebecca Siegel; two grandchildren and many other relatives and friends.
